10. Norman Love Confections 2010 Limited Edition Hanukkah Collection

Based in southwest Florida, Norman Love Confections was founded in 2001 by Norman and Mary Love, who create premium, handcrafted artisanal chocolates. As one of America's top 10 chocolatiers, the company has unveiled its first limited-edition Hanukkah 2010 collection of white, milk or dark chocolates (4-piece box, \$9; 16-piece box, \$34). These chocolates, while not kosher, are inspired by familiar baked goods and sweets:

Cinnamon Rugelach: These cinnamon-swirled cookies are blended with a rich white chocolate ganache and covered in a milk chocolate shell.

Cherry Cheese Blintz: Creamy smooth white chocolate and cheese ganache, fresh vanilla and cherry jam are layered within a white chocolate shell.

Baked Spiced Apple: Tart granny smith apples caramelized with cinnamon, vanilla, and sugar are pureed with sweet cream butter and then enrobed in a Swiss white chocolate shell.

Chocolate Dipped Coconut Macaroon: This rich dark chocolate confection contains buttery coconut cream and sweet toasted coconut flakes.

For the season, the company is offering eight limited-edition holiday flavors including Champagne, Candy Cane, Gingerbread, Eggnog, S'mores, Hot Toddy, Rum Raisin and White Christmas, with boxes ranging from \$13 to \$95.
